Federal Reviews

Clean Water Act Section 404 permit — discharge incident to proposed construction.

Decision whether to issue 404 permit involves both *procedural* and *substantive* requirements.

Key Procedural Requirement - NEPA compliance.

- EIS is a disclosure document that:
 - evaluates *impacts* of proposed project on full range of resources that make up the human environment.
 - evaluates *alternatives* to project and their impacts.
 - discloses *mitigation* for impacts and consequences that remain unavoidable.
- Purpose of EIS is 2-fold:
 - To inform *public* and give public opportunity to comment on impacts, alternatives, and mitigation.
 - To inform *federal permitting agencies* of facts so they make an informed decision on whether to grant or deny permit.

- EIS's issue in Draft and Final.
 - Public comment on Draft.
 - Public hearings.
 - Final EIS:
 - ~ More detail on mitigation.
 - ~ May reflect State/Local approvals.
 - ~ Includes refined analyses between Draft and Final.
 - ~ Responds to comments received on DEIS.
 - Typically, one year between Draft and Final.

Substance of Corps' Permitting – 404(b)(1) Guidelines.

- LEDPA test Project is the least environmentally damaging practicable alternative that meets the P&N.
- Project will not cause or contribute to violations of WQ standards, ESA, NHPA, and other laws.
- Appropriate and practicable steps have been taken to minimize adverse impacts on the aquatic ecosystem.
- Project will not result in significant degradation of waters of the US, after consideration of mitigation.

■ **Public interest review** — Corps is to issue a permit that meets the above criteria *unless it is contrary* to the public interest.

- **Public input** public notice on permit application; potential hearing(s) if requested.
- **Issuance of ROD** permit, if issued, will contain appropriate terms and conditions.

- Other Federal Approvals may apply, e.g.--
 - Reclamation approvals
 - Department of Transportation
- Two additional **Federal Laws** typically triggered by a decision pending on a federal permit:
 - **ESA Section 7 Compliance** If project "may affect" federally listed species or designated critical habitat.
 - Section 106 of National Historic Preservation Act federal agencies must consider the effects of their permitting actions on cultural resources that are eligible for or listed in National Register.
